What is an External PhD?

An external PhD allows professionals to pursue a doctoral degree part-time while remaining in their current roles. These candidates are typically self-funded or supported by their institutions. Admission into this route is highly selective and at the discretion of full professors. Professor Payal Arora, will be supervising 1–2 external PhD candidates per cycle whose research and professional interests align strongly with her expertise and the vision of the Faculty of Humanities at Utrecht University.

If you are part of the NL Internet Governance Forum (NL IGF) network and are passionate about shaping the future of data governance, AI ethics, and inclusive tech from a global, justice-oriented perspective, this opportunity is for you.

Research areas Prof. Arora is keen to supervise include:

- Data sovereignty, including from the Majority World perspective
- Alternative models of AI governance
- Best practices in tech governance including from beyond the Euro-American sphere
- Comparative studies on inclusive innovation and ethical frameworks

Your institutional affiliation may offer financial support for research degrees, making this a feasible pathway for career-embedded professionals.

Payal Arora is Professor of Inclusive AI Cultures at Utrecht University and co-founder of Inclusive AI Lab and FemLab. A digital anthropologist with two decades of field experience, she works to shape inclusive AI designs and policy globally. She is the author of 100+ academic articles and award-winning books including The Next Billion Users (Harvard Press). Forbes named her the 'next billion champion' and 'the right kind of person to reform tech.' She was listed in the 100 Brilliant Women in AI Ethics 2025 and received the 2025 Women in AI Benelux Award for her work on diversifying AI. Her latest book with MIT Press, From Pessimism to Promise: Lessons from the Global South on Designing Inclusive Tech, is a 2025 Axiom Business Book Awards Silver Medalist and was longlisted for the 2024 Porchlight Business Book Awards. Her work has been featured in 200+ global media outlets including The Financial Times, Fast Company, The Economist, Wired, and BBC. She has advised organizations like UNHCR, Spotify, Google, KPMG, Adobe, GE, IDEO, and serves on the boards of UN EGOV and LIRNEAsia. A sought-after speaker, she has delivered 350+ talks in 85 countries at events such as ACM FAccT, COP26, World Economic Forum, and TEDx.
